





Hijackers belonging to the international terrorist network Al Qaeda commandeered four commercial planes, crashing two into New York City's World Trade Center and one into the Pentagon in Arlington, Virginia. The fourth hijacked plane, presumably headed for the U.S. Capitol building in Washington, D.C., crashed into a Pennsylvania field. In all, nearly 3,000 people died in the attacks, making them the deadlest terrorist strike against the U.S. In the immediate aftermath of the attacks, the U.S., under the leadership of President George W. 



# **George by Alex Gino**


About a transgender person who is in fourth grade
